Personal Social Emotional Development

Activities:

- Objectives:**
- Initiates play offering cues for others to join them.
 - Take steps to resolve conflicts
 - Understand own actions can hurt/harm others
 - Confident to speak about interests and opinions/describe self in positive terms.
- Activities:**
- Circle times- rules, behaviour, feelings(topical)
 - Talking about what we are good at
 - Continuous provision activities to allow children to work together/ compromise and resolve conflicts.

Communication and Language

Objectives

- Able to follow a story without pictures or prompts
- Listen and respond to others- ideas expressed in a group
- Introduce a storyline/ narrative into their play.
- Maintain attention/listen in a range of situations

Activities

- Easter/Spring related stories.
- Discussions about growth and baby animals- what changes happen.
- Talk for writing- following a story without pictures or prompts.
- Story CD's- listening to stories.

Expressive Art and Design

Objectives

- Understand different media can be combined to create new effects.
Create representations of events, people and objects.
Play as a group to act out a narrative.
Choose colours for a purpose.

Activities

- Farm role play/vets role play
- Singing Easter/spring songs- Easter concert
 - Art project- painting farm animals in style of an artist.
 - Act out Little Red Hen/ ugly Duckling
 - Talk for writing
 - Create farm animals using number of materials.

Physical Development

Objectives

- Experiments with ways of moving
- Can dress self/ independently go to the toilet
- Begin to form recognisable letters.
- Hold pencil correctly and use it effectively
- Show understanding and need for safety when tackling new challenges/ managing risk
- Understand good practice- exercise

Activities

- Soccer Lions
- Forest schools- risk taking activities
- Name writing
- Drawing/ Labelling story maps
- PE sessions- gymnastics/dance

Maths

Objectives

- Language related to time, money, measure periods of time.
- 3D shapes- mathematical names and terms to describe
- One more/less than given number
- Begin to use vocabulary of adding/subtracting
- Counting objects to 10/beyond 10
- Record using marks and interpret and explain
- Find total number of items in two groups by counting all of them.

Activities

- Measure time- how long does the egg take to hatch/racing cars- measure fastest time
- Adding/subtracting /counting with animals on the farm
- 3D shapes- naming and describing activities
- Time- days of the week, months of the year (YR: O'clock/half past)

Literacy

Objectives

- Describe main story setting, events and characters.
- Hear and say initial sounds in words
- Write letters to represent words.
- Begin to write own name, and labels and captions.
- Writing sentences in meaningful contexts
